In Today's Gospel we read how riches kept a young man from becoming a disciple of Jesus. The Jews believed that the prosperity of the rich, was a sign of Gods blessing. But Jesus presents wealth as a stumbling block to the kingdom.

When Jesus says, 'Sell what you have...' he doesn't mean that a disciple must be destitute. But neither is the desire for the accumulation of possessions and wealth healthy.

Deep down we all have a longing for goodness. We dream, but are we prepared to act? We are no better for merely desiring things, without striving towards them. Our presence here on a Sunday, brings us face to face with the same question which the young man had for Jesus. Jesus asks the same of us as he did of that young man.

How might the words in this Gospel challenge me to follow Jesus more closely? That I may see the need of others.

Saint Mary MacKillop said -'never see a need without doing something about it.' Can I do that?

LITURGY: - ID YOU KNOW?

Rubrics : The rules of Church ceremonies that explain what actions are performed and what prayers are to be said. They are printed in the liturgical books in red.

Real Presence : The teaching of the Church which states that the crucified Christ and risen Christ is present in a special way in the Eucharist. The Second Vatican Council teaches that Jesus Christ is really present in the community that assembles for worship, in the person of the minister who presides in his name, in the word that is proclaimed, and in the consecrated bread and wine.

Sacraments of Initiation : Baptism , Confirmation and Eucharist are the sacraments of initiation. These sacraments are received at a persons entry or initiation into the Church.

The word of God discerns the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

No created thing can hide from him; everything is uncovered and open to the eyes of the one to whom we must give account of ourselves.

GOSPEL

Mk 10:17-30

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Go and sell whatever you have and come follow me.

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them, 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another, 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said, 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land – not without persecutions – now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.'
